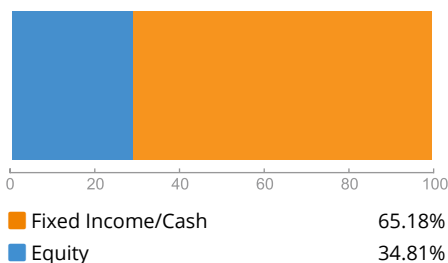

The Fund seeks to achieve its objectives by investing in Exchange-Traded Funds ("ETFs"). An ETF is a type of Investment Company which attempts to achieve a return similar to a set benchmark or index. 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The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life sub-accounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The Morningstar Rating does not include any adjustment for sales loads. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-yr (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. The Astor Sector Allocation Fund, Class A was rated against the following numbers of Tactical Allocation funds over the following time periods: 4-stars out of 228 funds in the last three years, 3-stars out of 214 funds in the last five years and 4-stars out of 132 funds in last 10 years. 29% of the fund's holdings receive an MSCI ESG Rating of AAA or AA (ESG Leaders) and 2% receive an MSCI ESG Rating of B or CCC (ESG Laggards). The fund ranks in the 56th percentile within the Mixed Asset USD Flex - US peer group and in the 51st percentile within the global universe of approximately 34,000 funds in coverage.

MSCI ESG Fund Ratings aim to measure the resilience of mutual funds and ETFs to financially material environmental, societal and governance (ESG) risks. Our ESG ratings provide a window into one facet of risk to financial performance.
